
The project is cooperated with Design For People Co., Ltd., as design partner and the light steel structure supplier.







Guantou village, lying on the southeastern side of the Tai-hang Mountain, shared the eminent Shanxi architectural style that featured by the brick courtyard house. The house, once home to a respectable family, had been abandoned after concrete residential buildings, which lately represented wealthy lifestyles, were built on the west side of the village.

We propose to consider rural rehabilitation and resource sustainable utility together with the renovation of the courtyard. In the meantime, it is a journey we took to document and understand traditional architectural tectonics.
